ORANJEMUND RIDES HIGH AT THE SHOW

THE PAST weekend saw the Oranjemund and Namaqualand equestrian fraternities gather for another highly successful annual show. The weather was glorious and the competition of an extremely high standard throughout the four-day event. Good organisation coupled with an excellent attendance, the usual excitement including falls, tears and winning smiles made the event one worth remembering.

Visitors from Kleinsee, Springbok, Cape Town and a large contingent of 13 riders from Aggeneys provided the much needed competition to keep the Oranjemund riders on their toes. The Oranjemund Riding Club was also privileged to have attained the services of two highly experienced judges. They were Vicky Goble, a standard horse judge from Simonstown in the Cape and Manty Oberholzer, an A-graded saddler judge from Karasburg in southern Namibia. Locals, Linda Wiseman and Trevor Ray judged the gymkhana.

After intensive competition the junior Victrix Ludorum trophy was awarded to Paula Ford, a visitor from Cape Town, while Chantelle Oliver took the honours as

Senior Victrix Ludorum. Junior Victor Ludorum for the show was T Goosen from Aggeneys with Senior Victor Ludorum honours being won by club chairman, John Huish.

Four-year-old Lee-Ann Jones was the youngest rider at the show while the most improved child rider award was shared by Stoffel de Beer and Morné Oelofse. Brandon van der Westhuizen and Angelique Smolders shared honours for pony dressage. Novice dressage was won by Lynda Smolders and junior dressage by visitor Paula Ford.

As predicted, the Kleinsee and Aggeneys contingents walked off with the Saddler trophies. B Koegelenberg (Kleinsee) is the champion 5-gaited rider; F Gagiano owns the champion 5-gaited horse and H van Niekerk the champion 3-gaited horse.

Both the junior and senior cross-country events saw their share of drama. Young Stephen Hockney fell, fracturing a collar bone and Tom Parkhill's mount refused at one of the jumps thereby disqualifying him. The tough, rough course ridden against the clock brings out the best in horsemanship. Showing fine form, John Huish proved a worthy winner of the senior event with Paul, following in father's footsteps by winning the junior event.

After a white horse was persuaded to visit the clubhouse bar and the presentation of the trophies, John Huish thanked

everybody involved in what, in his opinion, had been the best show ever.

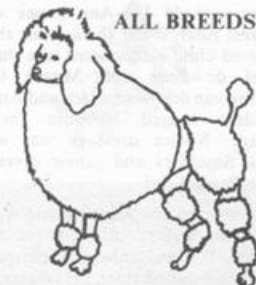

MINE TOURS

1. Bookings on mine tours will only be confirmed on receipt of the R2 donation. Monies should be paid to the cashier, Accounts Department and the receipt then presented to the typist/clerk in the Public Relations Department by not later than 15h00 on the Thursday preceding the tour.

2. The mine tour will commence at the Loss Control Induction Centre where an introductory video presentation will be screened. Passengers are requested to gather at the Centre by not later than 07h40.

3. From the Induction Centre passengers will be required to provide their own transport to the Personnel Control Centre from where the mine tour proper will commence at 08h15.

4. Children under the age of 14 and pregnant women are not permitted to accompany mine tours as health regulations stipulate that they should not be exposed to X-ray radiation except for medical reasons. Wheelchair patients will not be permitted to accompany mine tours.

5. Visitors should remove films from their cameras when they exit through the Personnel Control Centre in order to avert exposure or X-ray damage. With battery operated equipment such as photographic flashlights, calculators etc., the batteries will have to be removed and are forfeit by the owner. In terms of security regulations it is necessary to hand in other hand luggage for inspection prior to departure from the mining area.

"WHITE NIGHTS" SLIDE SHOW IN ORANJEMUND

A GOOD-SIZED and responsive audience was entertained on Friday night in the Camera Club Hall as Dr Tony Williams showed his slides taken in Norway. Nature lovers saw the Lapps in their very colourful, traditional costumes, pasture specially grown on roofs of houses because of the shortage of suitable land and picnics at midnight in the summer sun! Tony Williams and Liz Komen were in Oranjemund to carry out a mid-winter bird census at the river mouth.

On Saturday afternoon, 14 "twitchers" headed for Alexander Bay and although there were no great numbers of species recorded, some interesting facts came to light. The spoonbill, for instance, can be seen there regularly and was thought to nest much further up the river, until that is, a breeding pair, one sitting on the nest was found. The nest was a metre high tower of dried reeds, presumably to accommodate a rise in water-level. A pair of Fulvous Duck was seen again, as in the December count, thus doing no justice to the distribution maps in Roberts' Book of Birds. The crowning glory however, came the following day when a painted snipe was flushed out. This was probably the first-ever encounter in these parts and thus caused much excitement. It was lying close to the ground and took Tony's keen eye to spot it due to its wonderfully camouflaged form. Again, distribution maps proved to be quite inaccurate although in fairness, these maps are compiled from data collated over the years. If little data comes from an area, then that area cannot be expected to figure with any degree of accuracy. As a result of Tony and Liz's research at the river mouth, this area might be put on the map. Perhaps future editions of the various bird books, will show a far greater variety of avifauna and give a truer reflection of its diversity.

Whale Sightings

Two Southern Wright whales were spotted by Tony Williams and Liz Komen on Thursday, 10 July. Accompanying the huge mammals were three to five dolphins swimming some 800-1 000 metres out to sea.

Little information regarding sighting of whales along the Namibian coast is forthcoming, mainly due to the low population or perhaps because, although whales are seen, people do not know where to report their information.

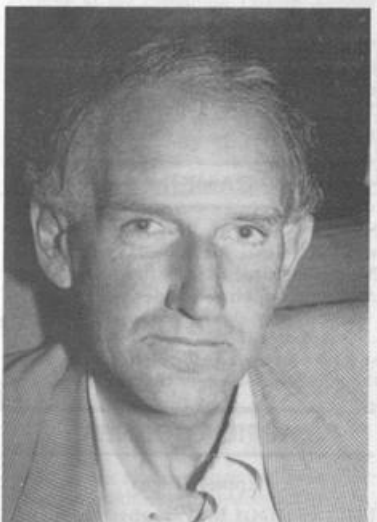

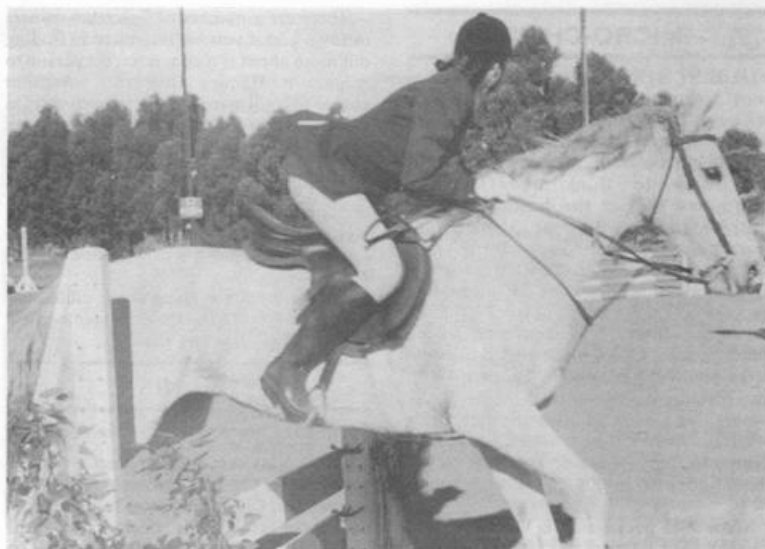
