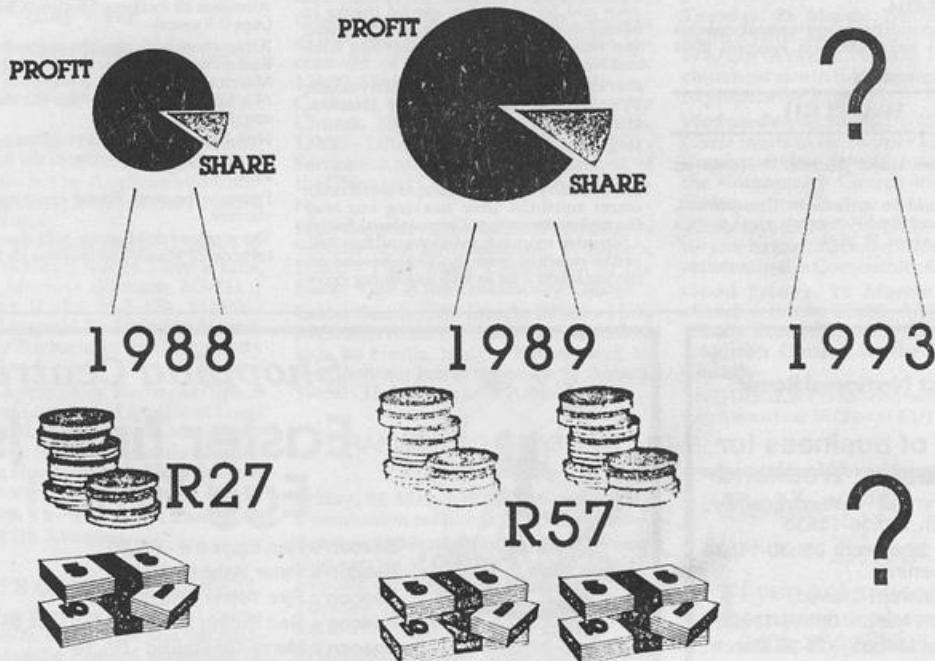

Unrepentant, he plants the beans which grow and become a rallying flag behind which the reluctant townsfolk eventually band together.

Two newcomers arrive in Milagro, one is Coyote Angel who feels the town needs a little divine intervention, the other is a young research student who learns a little of what forces motivate the superstitious and religious people.

A few miracles take place, the newspaper owner is forced to take sides and eventually the townsfolk, made up of some wonderful characters, unite and oust the developers and a particularly nasty federal agent who sets out to destroy Joe.

Some diverse talents, Reuben Blades, Richard Bradford, Sonia Braga and others are brought together in this amusing treatment of the tried-and-tested theme, fat cat developer trounced by poor underdogs.

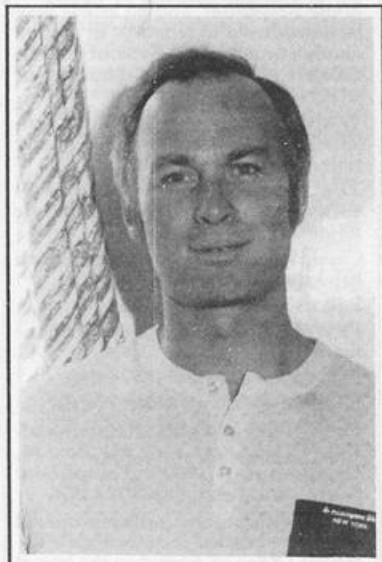

### Pedestrian Crossings - the right of way

Question:

**Who has the right of way at a pedestrian crossing?**

Answer:

**The driver of the vehicle.**

If you haven't caught the joke it is because there isn't one. It is a fact that roads are intended for vehicular traffic and hence drivers have the right of way. At a pedestrian crossing a driver shall yield his right of way to a pedestrian only if the pedestrian is already in the roadway on the pedestrian crossing. A driver is not obliged to stop but may yield simply by slowing down to allow the pedestrian sufficient time to complete the crossing. If he does stop the driver of the vehicle behind him must also stop.

It is up to the pedestrian, who has right of way only on the pavements, to make sure that there is no oncoming traffic before stepping out into the road at a pedestrian crossing or anywhere else.

Pedestrians are obliged, both by law and for their own safety, to show consideration for drivers by not causing them to stop suddenly by slipping into the road in the face of oncoming coming vehicles nor to hold up the traffic by dawdling across the road.

Senior traffic officer, Bossie Bosman, supplied the Newsletter with this information to clear up the apparent confusion regarding pedestrian crossings and warns road users, both drivers and pedestrians, that if they fail to abide by the rule of the road they are liable for criminal prosecution.



**Don't dash onto the road. Make sure there is no oncoming traffic, and that you have the right of way.**

**Consider the motorist especially when you walk onto pedestrian crossings. You may be right but you don't want to be dead right.**

## More Deaths On Killer Road

Tragedy struck on the Port Nolloth road again last month. A motor car accident in the early hours of the morning of Sunday, 26 February claimed the lives of two people and seriously injured three others.

Ms Sarah Laberlot (39) of Lüderitz and Ms Katrina Kook (28) of Bethaniene died when the car left the road and struck a concrete pillar near Muisvlak, about 20km from Port Nolloth. The driver of the car, Mr Anthony van Wyk (30) of Atlantis is in the Tygerberg Hospital having sustained a brain haemorrhage as did passenger Mr Joseph Bakker (25) of Concordia. Also injured in the crash was Ms Emma Boois (25) of Bethaniene who is in the Karl Bremer hospital in Cape Town with a broken pelvis.

All the occupants of the car were contractors working at CDM and were on their way from Beauvallon to Port Nolloth. Police are investigating the cause of the accident.

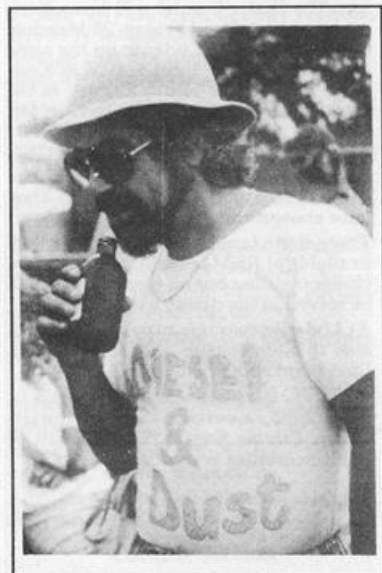
