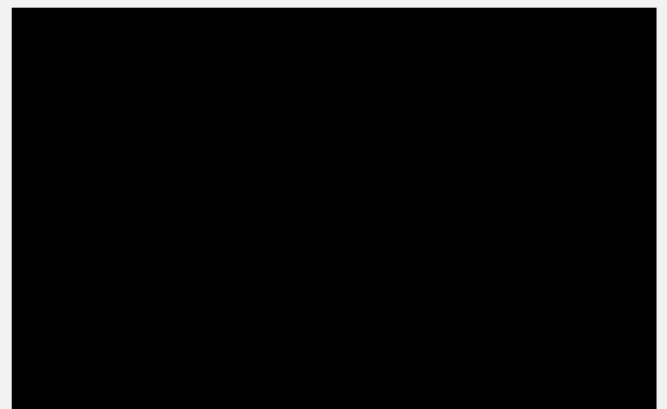
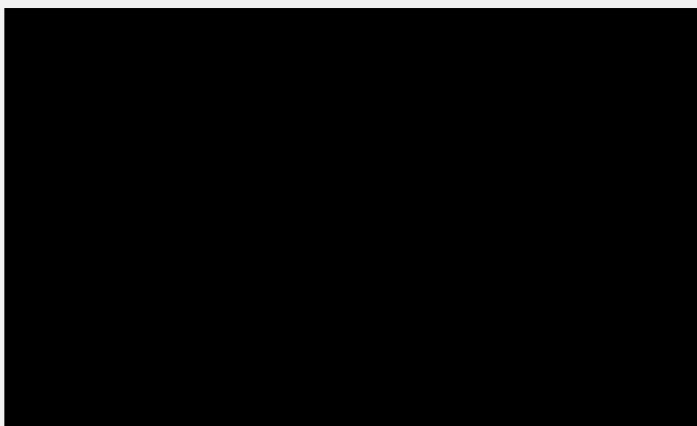
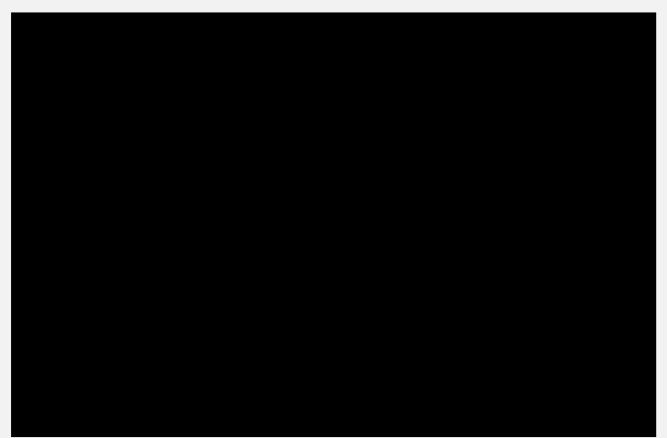
On Saturday, 21 September 2013, volunteers from the Oranjemund community joined the rest of the world and participated in the International Coastal Clean-up Day. This international event is held each year on the third Saturday in September when people head to the beaches and remove debris and rubbish from shorelines, waterways and oceans.

The aims of the clean-up are:

- . To remove litter and debris from all bodies of water;
- . To collect valuable information about litter and debris;
- . To heighten public awareness of the causes of litter and debris;
- . To make a positive change and to promote water pollution prevention efforts worldwide.

The Namibian Coast Conservation and Management Project (NACOMA) coordinates this event in Namibian's coastal towns such as Oranjemund, !Nami#Nüs (Lüderitz), Walvis Bay, Swakopmund and Henties Bay.
